- Class 1 Mini 70-75cm Team & Individual Qualifier (Riders to be aged under 14 on 1st January 2020)
 All team riders automatically count as individuals.
- Class 2 Novice 80-85cm Team & Individual Qualifier All team riders automatically count as individuals.
- Class 3 Intermediate 90-95cm Team & Individual Qualifier.
 All team riders automatically count as individuals
- Class 4 Open 1.00-1.05m Team & Individual Qualifier
 All team riders automatically count as individuals
- Class 5a/b Advanced 1.10m Individual Qualifier a) horses and b) ponies

1st & 2nd placed team & 1-4th placed individuals will qualify for the 24th annual NSEA National Schools Championships 2020 at Addington Manor in October 2020

3rd -8th placed team & 5th-8th placed individuals will qualify for the NSEA Championship Plate 2020 at Keysoe

- Class 6 Intro B warm up class. Individual only
- Class 7 Prelim 14 (2006) revised 2016. Individual* and team competition

 *U12 (01.01.20) riders must declare their eligibility for the U12 Championship category before the start of the show. Teams to be made up of 3 or 4 rider all riding he same test. All team members

Class 8 Novice 27 (2007). Individual entries only

automatically count as individuals.

- Class 9 Prelim 13 (2006) Revised 2016. Individual and team competition
- Class 10 Novice 28 13 (2008). Individual and team competition
- Class 11 Elementary 50 (2007). Individual only

Class 7 & 8 1st placed team and individual from the named counties will represent their county at the NSEA County Dressage Championships in April 2020 at Hartpury. Rosette for the highest paced U12*.

Class 9 – 11 1st and 2nd placed team and individual to qualify for National Championships in October 2020 at Addington, 3rd to 8th place team to qualify for Plate 2020 at Keysoe.

Rules - NSEA General Rules plus 'Additional Rules for Qualifiers 2020

Rules for County Team & Individual Dressage Qualifying Competitions (CchDQ)

There is a team and individual competition at Prelim level and an individual competition at Novice level.

CchDQ1) Two horse/ rider combinations from the original qualifying team MUST be included and declared at the Championships. Individual qualification refers to the horse/rider combination and therefore, neither the horse nor rider may be substituted at the Championships.

CchDQ2) Dressage teams are made up of 3 or 4 riders, all riding the same Prelim test. All team rider's scores also automatically count for individual Prelim placings. A rider who is not a part of a team, may compete as an individual.

CchDQ3) The test for 2020 Team and Individual Prelim Qualifiers is Prelim 14 (2006) revised 2016

CchDQ4) The test for 2020 Individual Novice Qualifiers is Novice 27 (2007)

CchDQ5) The County Dressage Team and Individual Prelim qualifier is open to horse & rider combinations that have not competed at British Dressage Novice level or above. Therefore, horse & rider combinations may compete at BD bronze prelim and silver prelim level and may have gained prelim points. Riders may have also competed at NSEA Novice level, but not Elementary (BD or NSEA).

CchDQ6) If a Horse/rider combination gains further points after qualification and it takes them over the threshold, they will forfeit their qualification to compete at the County Championships.

CchDQ7) The County Dressage Individual Novice series is open to rider/horse combinations not to have competed at BD Medium level or above or BE Intermediate level.

CchDQ8) Dressage tests may be called at qualifiers, however, not at the Championships. Headsets may be used in the warm up area but not during any test at any competition. Dressage whips may be carried in warm up arenas and during tests at qualifiers but not during the test at County Championships.

CchDQ9) There will be a rosette for the highest placed U12 (on 1st Jan 2020) rider in the prelim class at each County qualifier and the rider will be crowned junior County Champion. They will also qualify for a separate U12 Championship class at Hartpury.
