- All entries in Class 1 (Teams) will also be counted as individuals, and Class 1 (Individual) and Class 1 (Teams) will be run as one class.
- Teams can be made up of competitors eligible to compete in either group (ie a Group A competitor can join Group B competitors from the same school to make up a team) but that team MUST be entered in Group B (the older age group) not the other way round.
- Groups A and B will be combined if insufficient entries.

- Teams can be made up of competitors eligible to compete in either group (ie a Group A competitor can join Group B competitors from the same school to make up a team) but that team MUST be entered in Group B (the older age group) not the other way round.
- Groups A and B will be combined if insufficient entries.

- Teams can be made up of competitors eligible to compete in either group (ie a Group A competitor can join Group B competitors from the same school to make up a team) but that team MUST be entered in Group B (the older age group) not the other way round.
- Groups A and B will be combined if insufficient entries.

NSEA TEAMS

Teams of 3 or 4. Best three scores to count. (All team members automatically count as individuals). Teams can be made up of competitors eligible to compete in either section of each height (ie a Section A competitor can join Section B competitors from the same school to make up a team) but that team **MUST** be entered in Section B (the older age group) not the other way round.

NSEA CLASSES

All riders entering the NSEA Classes must be attending the school they are representing on the date of the competition, and all schools must be current NSEA members. Please quote NSEA number on entry form (www.nsea.co.uk).

Note: These NSEA events are run by organisers who also run BE events.

RULES

As for NSEA General Rules 2021-22 (see (8) Eventing for specific rules) and under the guidelines of British Eventing 2022, except:

- Riders do not need to be registered with BE
- Half chaps (no tassels) black or brown may be worn with standard jodhpur boots of the same colour. No hooded tops allowed.
- School Numnahs and Jackets, will be permitted.
- All hats must be tagged. BE/PC/RC acceptable. Any untagged hats should be taken to the Secretary before competing.

VACCINATIONS

All horses to have a current flu vaccination in accordance with NSEA General Rules.

ENTRY FEES

£190 per Team (of 3 or 4 members) £60 per Individual.

NUMBERS

You will be required to supply your own number and number bibs.

START FEES

There will be a £15.00 start fee payable. You will be required to pay your start fee with your entry – this will be refunded to you after the date of competition if you do not start the competition. Please ensure when making your entry that you tick the box and add the fee. Your entry will not be accepted without a valid start fee being paid.

REFUNDS

Withdrawals after 12 noon on 10 May 2022 will not receive a refund without a vet's certificate or doctor's certificate unless we can replace from a wait list, and will be subject to a £10.00 admin fee.. Vet's/doctor's certificate must be received by the Secretary within 48 hours of the withdrawal. No rider/horse changes after close of withdrawals.

DIRECTIONS TO STONAR

By road from the M4 (30 minutes):

Leave M4 at J17. At Stanton Saint Quinton roundabout take the 2nd exit on to the A350 signed “Chippenham, Poole”. Follow the A350 signposted “Warminster” all the way through to Melksham. Go straight over the mini roundabout and at the next roundabout turn right onto the B3107 signposted to “Bradford on Avon”. After 1.4 miles, turn right (opposite a red brick house) into Mill Lane. Continue straight on through village of Broughton Gifford. Approximately 1 mile after the village, you will come to a crossroads and straight ahead is the driveway to Stonar.

By road from Bath (20 minutes):

Follow A4 out of Bath. At Box take the A360 Devizes Road. At the 'Five-ways' traffic lights turn right towards Bradford on Avon onto the B3109. Turn left where signposted to “Stonar School” and “Atworth” (the turning is immediately before a garage and the right-hand turn is signposted “South Wraxall”). Continue along this road until you reach a crossroads. Turn left into the driveway to Stonar.

By road from A303 (south):

From eastbound A303 take A350 turn off north signposted “Warminster”. From westbound A303 take A36 turn off signposted “Warminster”. On reaching Warminster bypass take A350 via Westbury and Trowbridge to Melksham. Turn left at roundabout where A350 meets B3107 to Bradford on Avon. Follow directions above (from M4).

Please could horse lorries try to avoid going through the village of Atworth when coming to and from Stonar.
