NSEA Coronavirus Protocol

HEALTH CHECKS- *may be updated before the show, depending on updates in government protocols.*
See NSEA website for details

1. *If any competitor, or anybody in their household, is showing symptoms of Coronavirus, they must not attend any NSEA event. On the morning of the competition, prior to departure, there should be the following simple health check conducted:*

1. *Take the temperature of everybody in the household. If anybody has a temperature of over 37.8 degrees, then please seek medical advice and do not attend.*
2. *Is anybody in the household quarantined because of foreign travel to a country which is not exempt? If so, please do not attend.*
3. *If anybody in the household has any of the following symptoms then please seek medical advice, and do not attend:*
 1. *A persistent cough;*
 2. *A loss of taste or smell;*
 3. *A temperature (see 1(1) above)*

REGIONAL LOCKDOWNS OR REGULATIONS

2. *If any competitor lives, or stables their horse, in an area which has been made the subject of a specific geographical lockdown then please do not attend an event.*

3. *If the event* is located within an area which is subject to specific conditions, we will review those, and may cancel an event at short notice if required to do so.
4. *If the competitor's school* is located in an area which is subject to specific conditions, even if the competitor lives outside that area, if they have physically attended the school in the two weeks prior to the competition, they should not attend.
5. For competitors who live near borders between England and Wales, or England and Scotland, please be mindful of the potentially differing rules once you cross a border, and familiarise yourself with those rules.

AT THE SHOW CENTRE

6. One person per squad should take charge of ensuring social distancing to ensure that everybody keeps their distance. They should familiarise themselves with one-way systems and protocols specific to each venue which will be available. Regular reminders will need to be given as it is easy to forget things when both on, and off, a horse. Remember to avoid sharing equipment. Household groups - or bubbles - should be maintained when moving around and please follow show centre instructions. Check in advance, for example, to see what, if any, catering facilities are available and plan accordingly.
7. Avoid touching surfaces like jumps or rails, and follow instructions given by show centres.
8. **No spectators or supporters will be permitted. Just one parent/guardian per competitor is encouraged wherever possible as numbers on site must be kept low.**
9. Do not forget to use hand sanitiser on arrival. Show centres will be providing this, but if there are shortages it is obviously sensible to bring your own which should be used regularly. Practise good hand-hygiene as often as possible throughout the day; show centres will all have soap and hot water available.
10. Any person at the event who becomes unwell should immediately isolate with their household, and if necessary should seek medical attention from the Paramedic team in attendance at NSEA events. The household with the unwell person in should leave the show centre to return home.
11. Please do not stay longer than is necessary for the competition. ARRIVE, COMPETE, LEAVE, in order to minimise the number of people at a show centre at any one time. All results will be published online.

BREACHES OF THE PROTOCOL

12. If breaches of this protocol are brought to the attention of show organisers, they will be permitted to demand the entire school's team leave the show centre, and may eliminate competitors. The NSEA will then consider whether to allow that school or competitor to compete in future competitions.

Please ensure that you do not muck out your horsebox onto the Car Park. Horses must not be left tied to vehicles unattended. Take all litter home with you.

All dogs must be kept on leads at all times. Any dog mess must be cleared up.

Outside assistance will not be tolerated- and could result in elimination.

NSEA affiliated competitors only may warm up & compete horses on the show ground

All competitors, parents and representatives from every school must ensure that they act courteously to stewards and officials at all times- most of them are volunteers and give up their time for your sport.

Refunds- only with a vet cert / doctors note less £5 per entry admin fee.

The NSEA will not be held responsible for any financial loss incurred by any entrant, their associates or attendees as a result of a re-arrangement to the schedule, postponement or cancellation of a competition.

In the event of cancellation, your entry will be refunded on receipt of an email, less £5 per entry admin fee.

Classes

Competitors will be given times for their competition rounds and their warm ups. Horses will be expected to be taken back to boxes after each round. All classes and jumping warm ups are on sand surfaces.

The number per school needs to be **kept to a minimum**. 1 adult per child where possible please. (Riders with multiple horses may have 1 extra adult)

Warm Up areas

A limited number of horses will be allocated to the various warm up areas at any time. These will be stewarded.

A marked hacking area will also be available. Horses may not be grazed or exercised in any other area.

1 adult in the warm up area at a time to put up jumps. Please ensure that they are available for everyone - do not hog them! Use the hand sanitiser before entering the warm up area.

Numbers

Arena Eventing classes. Please make your own number and display in your own eventing bib.

SJ classes may print numbers or bring a bridle number for each horse. No paper numbers will be given out this year.

Prize givings

There will be no official prize givings. Team Managers are encouraged to collect prizes and present to their riders. Winning teams & individuals will be asked to send a socially distanced photo with their prizes to the NSEA in order that we can celebrate with you.

Horse walks Single file at all times and no loitering!

Limited numbers per course walk. **Fences may be looked at, but not touched.**

Please bring a face mask per person, as per government guidelines. Face masks will be needed for course walks, all indoor areas, queues etc
