**Team Qualifiers:** Teams of 3 or 4 with the best 3 percentage scores to count.  
A horse/rider combination may only compete in one team.

### **Class 1: County Prelim Teams & Individuals**

Open to Prelim riders who have never ridden above BD Bronze Prelim level, any Novice level dressage (affiliated or unaffiliated), Open Pony Club dressage or Novice BE Eventing.

**Test: Prelim 12 (2005) revised 2016**

The winning team and individual from each respective county will represent their county at the NSEA Inter County Finals. If there are two sections per class, a ride off will determine the result.

*(2023 Inter-County Prelim Team Champions- Abbotsholme, Staffordshire)*

### **Class 2: Open Teams & Individuals**

**(Please enter the correct section on the entry system)**

**2a Prelim Team Riders (x2)**

**2b Prelim individual riders**

**2c Novice Team Riders (x2)**

**2d Novice individual riders**

**Teams are made up of 2 x prelim riders & 2 x novice riders.  
All team riders automatically count as individuals as well.**

Prelim section is open to horse & rider combinations that have not competed at British Dressage Elementary level or above.

Novice section is open to all.

**Prelim Test: Prelim 14 (2006) revised 2016**

**Novice Test: Novice 27 (2007)**

The winning team and individual from each respective county will represent their county at the NSEA Inter County Finals. If there are two sections per class, a ride off will determine the result.

*(2023 Inter-County Open Team Champions – Mayfield, East Sussex)*

**Individual tests are run in conjunction with the team tests and riders in a team automatically qualify for individual places. You only need to enter as a team OR as an individual.**
