The Hurst College National Schools Jumping Championships

*** CHANGES FOR 2023 ***

In collaboration with our long-standing sponsors, Hurst College, and in consultation with several of our regular attendees, the 59th running of the National Schools Jumping Championships will be held on Friday 30th June this year. The calendar has become so busy and finding a date that suits all parties is becoming increasingly difficult, but we feel this date is the most fitting as it must follow one of our main events if we are to continue to give the children the opportunity to compete in the International Arena.

We will be introducing several changes to the programme this year. Regrettably, due to a decline in numbers, we have made the decision to drop the National Pony Club Championships from the schedule. Whilst disappointing, this has created space in the day to allow individual competitors in both the Junior Schools (now 85cms) and Senior Schools (now 1.00m) divisions.

For the first time, reserve riders (max 2 per team) and schools unable to field a team (max 2 per school) may jump as an individual at the conclusion of the preliminary team competition in the outside ring. All those jumping a clear round (including riders who are part of a team that does not qualify) will qualify to jump in the International Arena at the conclusion of the Team Championship. All those competitors that jump a clear round in the Team Finals or jump a clear round as an individual in the International Arena will go forward to a timed jump-off. This is an exciting addition and one we hope will result in more schools being represented across the day.

Schools' teams will still be open to four riders, with the best three scores to count. The Hickstead Elite 1.10m NSEA Individual Championship will again kick off proceedings in the International Arena.

Please note, all entries must be completed online at <https://equilive.uk> by 16th June. Just go to the website using your PC, tablet or phone and register your school, your riders, and their horses, and then you'll be able to log in to your account to add your entries. There is a very comprehensive help section on the EquiLive website should you have any problems. Longines International Arena

8.30am **THE HICKSTEAD ELITE 1.10m NSEA INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIP** **Single Phase**

Class 1A/1B Speed 325m per minute. To be judged under Hickstead and British Showjumping rules. Maximum height of fences 1.10m. Open to 25 ponies & 25 horses who have qualified at one of the NSEA qualifying competitions. Horses/ponies of any height or grade.

- **CLASS 1A** **Ponies**
- **CLASS 1B** **Horses**

Ponies will jump first, followed by the horses (distances will be altered). The final classification will be decided on faults and time across both sections, i.e., one set of prizes.

ENTRY FEE: £40 PRIZES: The winning rider will receive a lesson with Shane Breen, plus a Hickstead rug, rosettes and prizes in kind to 6th place

Rules Governing the Hurst College National Schools Jumping Championships

- 1 Speed 325m per minute. Table A. To be judged under Hickstead and British Showjumping rules, except for Rule 212.2. The third refusal will incur elimination.
- 2 Open to any school, for teams of **FOUR** horses/ponies of any height or grade.
- 3 Maximum height of fences **85cms** for the Junior Division, and **1.00m** for the Senior Division.
- 4 No horse or rider may compete in more than one schools team (Junior or Senior), and no horse or rider may compete more than once in the same team. Riders and/or horses may compete in the NSEA competition on the same day, provided they are qualified. If teams choose to bring a reserve rider, they must be clearly identified at the time of declaration and may jump as an individual at the end of the class when all teams have completed.
- 5 The Competition will be run in two divisions:
 - (a) THE JUNIOR DIVISION for riders under 14 years of age on **1st September 2022**, who have attended the school entering the team during the previous Summer Term, or who have proof of enrolment signed by the senior management entitling them to compete for the school they will be attending in the Autumn Term.
 - (b) THE SENIOR DIVISION for riders under 18 years of age on **1st September 2022** who have attended the school entering the team during the previous Summer Term, or who have proof of enrolment signed by the senior management entitling them to compete for the school they will be attending in the Autumn Term.
- 6 The Championship will be decided as follows:
 - (i) There will be a preliminary competition in Equine America Ring 3. Each complete team will enter the ring and start in jumping card order. Each rider will go through the start and finish and will NOT start before the bell. Each rider will jump one round only. The other members of the team will wait in a holding box in the ring until it is their turn to jump. The score of the team will be found by adding together the faults of the best three riders in the team – the worst score will be dropped. The ten highest placed teams in each division will go forward to the final in the Longines International Arena. If the number of teams on equal faults exceeds ten, places in the finals will be decided by a jump-off. Teams will nominate one rider to jump off against the clock. Reserve riders (max 2 per team) and schools unable to field a team (max 2 per school) may jump as an individual at the conclusion of the preliminary team competition. All those jumping a clear round will qualify to jump in the Longines International Arena at the conclusion of the Team Championship.

- (ii) The finals will take place in the Longines International Arena. In the final, the team with the most faults in the preliminary competition will start first, and the team with the least, last. The number one rider from each team will jump first, followed by the number two rider, and so on. Faults incurred in the preliminary competition will not be carried forward to the final. In any round if a rider is eliminated, they will incur the worse score in the round plus 20 faults. In the event of a tie for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock.
- (iii) At the conclusion of each Schools Jumping Team Championship, there will be an Individual Championship. All those competitors who jump a clear round in the Team Finals or jump a clear round as an individual in the Longines International Arena will go forward to a timed jump-off. If there are no clear rounds, the best scores, e.g., the four faulters, from the first round will jump-off. In the event of there being only 2 to jump-off, the third placing will be decided on faults and time in the first round in the Longines International Arena. If a jump-off is needed to decide the Team Championships, the scores of any eligible individuals involved in that jump-off will count towards the Individual placings, i.e., they will not jump-off again. There will be three individual placings in each division.
- (iv) There will be a separate awards ceremony in the Longines International Arena for each division. The Team & Individual prizetings and a parade of all teams will take place after each Final. Every rider will receive a rosette.
- 7 Jackets, jodhpurs or breeches, boots, and hats in line with current pony club or BS rules must be worn. It is requested that riders should have their school crest, colour or other identification on their saddlecloths, or wear school blazers in their school colours. SASHES MAY BE WORN BUT NOT IN THE PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY.

HICKSTEAD GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 All riders at these events, their parents and friends may use the Members' Enclosure at no charge. Admission for cars and occupants is free. All entries to be completed online at <https://equilive.uk>. All teams and individual riders must declare either by telephone or at the Show Office by 5.00pm the day before (29th June).
- 2 Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and all other charges other than in accordance with British Showjumping rules. Should any competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, entry fees will be refunded. It is regretted that stabling and other charges cannot be refunded.
- 3 The Hickstead Organising Committee reserves the right to award wildcards to the NSEA competition, to make up the numbers if necessary and as they see fit.
- 4 **STABLING** is available on Thursday and Friday at £40.00 per box per night. No horses/ponies will be admitted to the showground before 3.00pm on Thursday 29th June. Shavings are available for purchase at Hickstead, or exhibitors may bring their own. It is regretted that straw is banned from the Stable Field due to Fire Regulations. It is a requirement to put your mobile number on your horsebox pass which must be displayed in the windscreen. It is prohibited for any exhibitor or associate to interfere with another exhibitor's horsebox.
- 5 Any competitor found riding in the ring without permission will be disqualified from the show. All warming up must be done in the area provided.
- 6 Neither the All England Jumping Course nor the Executive nor Hickstead Limited nor any of its or their officers, servants or agents shall be in any way liable for any accidents, injury, damage, loss or for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors, competitors or their servants, agents or to anyone on the showground or to any animal or to any property brought on to the showground or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstances or event whatsoever in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the show or any journey to or from the show, the Executive of Hickstead Limited or any of them or its or their officers, servants or agents of these or any other Rules and Regulations or Special Conditions prescribed by them.
- 7 The Executive may in any dispute or other matter whatsoever, act or decide in any manner they think fit.
