Grass Roots Show Jumping Championships Festival 2025 Wednesday 20th August

Open to team & Individuals who have qualified in top 6 teams & individuals for one of the Grass Roots Regional Finals. NSEA Grass Roots Rules apply to classes 11-14 and RPL Rules for classes 21-23

The aim of the Grass Roots Festival Classes is to give riders a championships feel in a wonderful, iconic setting

Eligibility for Grass Roots classes

Riders NOT eligible for Grass Roots include-

Riders who have competed at 90cm are not eligible for Grass Roots.

Pony/rider combinations who have completed 5 x 80cm competitions are not eligible for Grass Roots, but the rider can ride a different pony in 60 and 70cm classes.

Riders who have competed in affiliated show jumping or eventing at 80cm or above, Pony Club regionals at 80cm, BSPS or Trailblazers at Championships level at 80cm or individually at NSEA National Championships in October at 80cm, are not eligible for Grass Roots Classes.

Riders who qualify for the Grass Roots Championships and then subsequently jump themselves out of their qualification are able to upgrade their qualification to the NSEA RPL Individual Championships (70-90cm) which runs at Hickstead in August at the same time as the Grass Roots Championships)

ANY RIDER who has competed in ANY 80cm class (or higher) on ANY pony in ANY competition (not just NSEA) is immediately ineligible for Grass Roots 40 & 50 cm qualifiers & Championship classes. They may compete h/c individually

Grass Roots Championships Classes

Class 11A 40cm Team & Individual Championships (may be led/ run with)
Class 11 B) 40cm Team & Individual Championships (assisted in the ring- stationary)
Teams can be made from riders competing in A or B, or both.

Class 12 50cm Team & Individual Championships (may be assisted in the ring)

Class 13 60cm Team & Individual Championships (may not be assisted)

Class 14 70cm Team & Individual Championships (may not be assisted)

Class 15 Grass Roots Points League Team Challenge (new for 2025)

(Please enter after end June when the final results are published)

Teams of 3 or 4 riders. Riders opt for a height they have qualified for – 40, 50, 60 70. No rider may ride twice. No pony may compete twice in this class.

Single phase, no riders to be led but can be assisted at 40 & 50,

LeMieux Hobby Horse Championships

Open to competitors placed in the top 10 at any NSEA Hobby Horse Qualifier

Class 34 Mini Hobby Horse Jumping Championships (Wed pm)

Class 35 Maxi Hobby Horse Jumping Championships (Wed pm)

Class 36 Hobby Horse & Hound pairs relay Championships (Wed pm)

The winner is the competitor / team who complete/s the course with no jumping penalties in the fastest time.

HH Riders will need to ride their hobby horse astride and try to keep at least 1 hand on the reins or mane over the jump. The horse needs to be facing forwards over the obstacles.

4 jump penalties are added if the pupil knocks a fence down or has a stop.

The course will be timed from the start to finish. Pairs classes- competitors need to touch hands in a holding area, between the end of one round and the start of the other.

Placing

Grass Roots Rules No Spurs in Grass Roots. Baton whips only.

40cm Grass Roots (Riders may be led or assisted from within the ring)

The class is judged by using a combination of show jumping penalties and style marks over a simple course of fences.

Rider's placings in the class are determined, first by show jumping penalties, with the ultimate placings, of those on the same jumping penalties, determined by style marks. The winner, therefore, is the rider, from those with the fewest jumping penalties, who has the highest style mark.

There is a, very generous, maximum time.

Classes may be split into a) led (either on a lead rein or running besides/ in front of, the pony) and b) assisted from within the ring

ANY RIDER who has competed in ANY 70cm class (or higher) on ANY pony at ANY competition (not just NSEA) is NOT eligible for this class, (except h/c if space permits)

50cm Grass Roots. Riders may be assisted from within the ring but not led . No outside assistance. The Assistant cannot carry a whip.

Optimum time. The winner will be the horse/rider combination who have the fewest jumping penalties and are closest to the optimum time. **There will be an additional prize for the most stylish rider who jumps clear in this class**.

ANY RIDER who has competed in ANY 80cm class (or higher) on ANY pony in ANY competition (not just NSEA) is immediately ineligible for Grass Roots 40 & 50 cm qualifiers & Championship classes. They may compete h/c individually.

Grass Roots 60 & 70cm classes (for novice riders)

Combinations may only jump 60 and 70 GR restricted classes, providing they have not completed 5 x 80cm classes, nor have qualified as an individual for the 80/85cm National Championships in October Riders who have competed in affiliated show jumping at 70cm or above or eventing are eligible for RPL classes

60cm Grass Roots

Single phase competitions, no outside assistance.

70cm Grass Roots

Single phase, no outside assistance

Riders jumping at this level are not eligible for 40cm Grass Roots on ANY pony.

Rider/pony combinations jumping at this level are NOT eligible for 50cm classes.

NOTE- The International Arena including the DERBY BANK are out of bounds.

Online payments only

Any wild card riders who are substituted into a team must have completed a competition at the relevant height. NO INDIVIDUALLY QUALIFIED HORSE OR RIDER MAY BE SUBSTITUTED

Team riders who have also qualified as an individual at the same height only pay once and will jump once (but their score will count for both) Please complete this information on the Declaration Form.

Important Information for Team Managers.

RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE MADE ON PASSPORTS THROUGHOUT THE COMPETITION

Please read **thoroughly.** Team Managers are required to know this information.

1. All **entries** and **enquiries** regarding this championships to **NSEA only.** Email <u>fw.nsea@gmail.com</u> **HICKSTEAD ARE not dealing with any show enquiries other than stabling**

- 2. All **stabling** to be booked only through the Hickstead online system, if you require onsite stabling
- 3. Only teams and individuals qualified for the Grass Roots and RPL championships are eligible to compete in these classes.
- 4. Please read rules carefully for eligibility for all disciplines at the show.

All Rules for the Championship classes and qualification rules for teams can be found on the NSEA website.

- 5. The **Team Manager** is responsible for the conduct and welfare of their school's horses, riders and other connected parties.(parents, supporters etc) at **all times** on the show ground.
- 6. No dogs IN THE JUMPING ARENAS OR WARM UP . Please bring Poo bags!
- 7. Gas BBQ's ONLY. No ground BBQs or chimneas in lorry park.
- 8. Hook ups to be arranged with Hickstead
- 9. All jumping courses may be raised a little from the qualifiers to the Championships.
- 10. In the event of cancellation, entry fees shall be refunded, less £5 per competitor per class to help cover admin costs.
- 11. No refunds except with a Doctor's note / Vet cert. See NSEA Rules.
- 12. **After 10p.m, the stable area should be quiet**. Please be aware that horses need to rest and therefore noise, lighting and intrusion should be kept to an absolute minimum.
- 13. A contact number must be left on a piece of tape on the stable door of every horse in case of an emergency.
- 14. Camping in tents is permitted, but an adult must stay on site with riders.
- 15. Horses should not arrive after 10pm and before 6am. Hickstead and the NSEA reserve the right to refuse entry to, and remove, any individual without giving a reason. If you want to park together, please arrive together.
- 16. The end of the show will be deemed to be half an hour after the last horse competes.
- 17. The NSEA will not be held responsible for any financial loss incurred by any entrant, their associates or attendees as a result of a re-arrangement to the schedule, postponement or cancellation of this competition. The **Team Manager** is responsible for the conduct and welfare of their school's horses, riders and other connected parties.(parents, supporters etc) at **all times** on the show ground.

Conditions of Entry 2025

Team Managers- please ensure that all horses / riders are correctly qualified for the classes they are entered for. All competitors, parents and representatives from every school must ensure that they act courteously to stewards and officials at all times. Rudeness and unsportsmanlike behaviour are not acceptable and could result in elimination.

Please help us to ensure that this Championship is run in the true spirit of competition and fair play.

In order to compete in events listed on the NSEA website, all competing schools must now be members of the NSEA, and show their membership number on entry forms. For full details of how to join go to www.nsea.org.uk
Entries must be made in advance, late entries to be accepted at the discretion of the organisers.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry, for any reason.

Competitors must wear correct clothing and tack in accordance with NSEA & BD/ BS rules.

Lungeing is not permitted in any working area. No adults to warm up horses on the show ground.

The decision of the judges is final.

Children under 16 must be supervised at all times.

All riders MUST wear hard hats, correctly fitting and to the latest BSI specifications according to the rules with the chin strap done up whilst mounted. All dressage hats must have a fitted chin strap.

Whilst not compulsory, we recommend that riders wear a body protector whilst jumping.

Any objections must be made, by the Team Manager, to the organiser within 5 minutes of the completion of the event, in writing on an official adjudication form, accompanied by a deposit of £30 which may be forfeited if the objection is overruled.

The organisers shall not be liable for any claims in respect of damage or accident to any person, whether competitor, servant or spectator, horse, vehicle or property, howsoever caused in conjunction with or arising out of the show.
